His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios characterized this Clergy-Laity Congress as a Herculean achievement because all of the reports of the various committees were approved and the efforts of the plenary sessions were crowned with success.

The reports of the various committees included the following: report on Religious Education, on Greek Education, on Youth and Young Adult Ministry, Archdiocesan Advisory Committee on Science and Technology, Hellenic College and Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology, Report of the Communications Committee, Inter-marriage Committee, the Finance Committee, the Committee on the Regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. I am pleased to report that all of the discussions were productive and peaceful.

There were many workshops offered by the Archdiocese Office of Parish Development. They included raising funds as a component of parish life; church music and how to learn Byzantine Chant; developing a family-based catechetical program; various parish ministries including, grief and bereavement/challenge, bulletin builder, and bringing the Church on the college campus; parish accounting and budgeting; parish management software: members, families, and mailing lists; Adobe photoshop: making photoshop work for your parish; Orthodox web site builder: using the Archdiocesan Web Site's tools and services for parish ministry; ministering to intermarried couples and their families; philanthropic ministries in the parish; outreach and evangelism in the small parish; gaining credit by exam for the Greek Language in public schools; planning and developing a successful parish web site; parish e-mail: introduction to the "GOARCH Mail" system; time out for family: bringing the gospel alive in the home; marketing a unified faith in contemporary society; premarital pastoral care: ministering to those planning to be married and other very important workshops. The workshops offered by our Archdiocese, with its limited financial resources, exceeded our expectations in providing practical information to serve our spiritual needs in the 21st century.

The first sign of success of the 37th Clergy-Laity Congress was the massive participation of over 1,100 delegates. In addition, there were delegates to the National Philoptochos Convention, to YAL, to National Sisterhood of Presvyteres and the Retired Priests, many observers and family members.

The participation in the educational seminars was very high. More than 2,500 people participated in these seminars. The overwhelming interest is a clear indication of our people's dedication and thirst for a comprehensive dialogue.

On Sunday, July 25, 2004 Archbishop Demetrios celebrated the Divine Liturgy with the

assistance of the Hierarchs of the Eparchial Synod. More than 1,000 faithful attended the service. Later in the afternoon, Archbishop Demetrios opened the exhibition area of 77 booths.

On Monday morning, following the Doxology Service officiated by Archbishop Demetrios, the 37th Biennial Clergy-Laity Congress got under way with welcoming remarks by Congress Chairman Nicholas J. Booras, Archdiocesan Council Vice Chairman Michael Jaharis, New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg and by other dignitaries. Metropolitan Panteleimon of Tyroloi and Serention delivered a message from Ecumenical Patriarch Bartolomew I.

Monday evening, we enjoyed the National Philoptochos Grand Banquet. The banquet was attended by 1,600 people. Keynote speaker was Nane Annan, a native of Sweden, the wife of U.N. Secretary General Kofi Annan and former legal officer for the U.N. Commission for Refugees in Geneva. Mrs. Annan praised the Philoptochos' support for numerous international philanthropic projects, including UNICEF and the safe water project, which helps developing nations provide safe drinking water for their populations. Mrs. Annan expounded on the hardships and poverty many children face in nations such as Ghana, Kenya, India, Botswana and others because of the lack of safe water supplies, which the U.N. safe water project seeks to remedy. "What you do is care," said Mrs. Annan of the Philoptochos. "I know that's why you are here, because you care."

Archbishop Demetrios, in his keynote address, highlighted the progress over the past two years since the 36th Biennial Clergy-Laity Congress in Los Angeles. The number of ordinations and of those who are candidates for the priesthood have increased. The Archbishop emphasized the importance of the new charter of our Church, the significant changes in the structure of the Holy Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate to include hierarchs from the eparchies of the Patriarchate, including Archbishop Demetrios. "Participation in the administration of the Ecumenical Patriarchate constitutes an honor and awesome responsibility for our Church. We will be there whenever matters about the Church are to be discussed" the Archbishop said.

The Archbishop emphasized the importance of education of the Christian Orthodox family, our responsibility as members of the living body of Christ, the Church. Building Communities of Faith and Love: Orthodox Parishes in Worship and Ministry is the work of clergy and lay people working together. The year, 2005, will be the year of the family for our Archdiocese in America.

All of the committees worked diligently, particularly the committee working on the by-laws

concerning the Metropolises and the uniform by-laws of the parishes. Two long plenary sessions on Wednesday and Thursday approved the work of the committees. On Friday morning, July 30, all the clergy met with Archbishop Demetrios.

The 37th Biennial Clergy-Laity Congress entered the books of history, but did touch our hearts. It was peaceful, productive and encouraging for all of us and above all for our beloved Greek Orthodox Church in America.

Message from your President

Dear Parishioners

I just returned from the Clergy Laity Congress held in New York City from July 25th to July 29th. My husband and myself were delegates. We both attended the administration meetings where the new by-laws of the Archdiocese were presented. Every section and article was discussed asking for corrections, additions, and deletions. It took 2 ½ days, plus the plenary session where they were reviewed again, to get through all the sections. At the plenary session the new Archdiocesan, Metropolis, and Parish regulations were unanimously passed. The regulations now go to the Patriarchate to be approved. We both attended stewardship, finance, and how to fundraise workshops. I attended outreach/evangelism and mission workshops. Also there was a woman who spoke on nursing in the community (blood pressure, cholesterol testing, etc. Its very inspirational to see all the ministries that are going on in our Archdiocese and in the different communities. Many dedicated people doing marvelous things on basically a small budget. The Keynote speaker of the Philoptochos banquet was Nane Annan, the wife of the United Nations Secretary-General. She has done much philanthropic work even before he became secretary-general. She spoke so graciously and was so inspirational that it brought tears to our eyes. Six women were honored for their philanthropic work. Pauline Callas O'Neal, the banquet co-chair presented the awards and she did an outstanding job. The main banquet was just as grand with many speakers, who all had something very special to say to us. All were very inspiring. Of course, Archbishop Demetrios spoke so eloquently, delivering a great message. It was a privilege for me and my husband to attend. I have been exposed to the many ministries that are taking place in our Archdiocese, and this knowledge will help me serve the community in a more informed capacity.

Our festival is just around the corner, September 17, 18, and 19th. Charlie Christodoulelis and Nicholas Politis, our co-chairmen and their committee are working very hard to assure

us of another successful year. Everyone should have received their festival packets asking you to volunteer your time, buy an ad for the ad book, and make a donation. Please, do not set it aside. The only way the festival works is with the entire community's involvement. We still depend on our festival to pay part of our operational expenses for the church. Until we can get everyone to participate as a steward of St. Anthony's, the profit of the festival is imperative to cover our "bills". We should be able to do this without the help of the public, then we could use the profits from the festival for inspirational, educational and building programs. Please do what you can, we need all of your support and I know we will have it.

Vacation Bible School, a great ministry of our church, took place the first week of August for all our children. Around 67 children participated. I want to thank Irene Albeck and Esther Vavoulis who made this program possible. So many mothers, fathers and grandparents volunteered their time to insure that our children would have an inspirational, educational, musical, and fun week. The children that attended will have these wonderful memories that will last a lifetime.

The executive committee of the parish council, Fr. Efstathios V. Mylonas, Nicholas Politis, Steven Pappas, Irene Albeck and myself met with all the leaders and presidents of the various organizations of our parish. We discussed schedules for the year, concerns, and the use of the Hellenic Center plus other things. More importantly it was nice to get together and give everyone a chance to meet each other. We received a lot of positive feedback from each other. We plan to meet at least twice a year.

A note about the album. The committee is working very hard to complete this book and send it to the printers. Judie Christopoulos has spent hours and hours on this project. The task was larger than we all could have imagined. Although the final profit of the album cannot be determined until the book is printed, so far we have been able to put an additional \$200,000 into the building fund from the album and the last golf tournament. Thank you for your support and patience.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

The first week of August the Cultural Center was transformed into Camp Creation featuring seventy children 4-13 years old. This was the fifth year Saint Anthony's has held Vacation Bible School. The theme verse was "The earth and everything on it belong to the Lord." Psalm 24:1. Each day children would gather together in their classrooms then attend worship time in the hall. Father Mylonas opened worship time with a prayer; followed by staff members performing a skit leading into the Bible story of the day. Michelle Prappas concluded worship time directing students in music and preparing for our Friday evening program. Students returned to their classrooms for the lesson of the day, memory verse and activities relating to the Bible story. The cabin craft center was set up in the hall and each day a special keepsake craft was made by each camper to reinforce the lesson. Campers discovered Christian stewardship through the Mission Center by bringing in their mission envelopes with money they earned or saved to go towards building an Orthodox church, Saint Herman in Spruce Island, Alaska. As each child brought in their envelopes they were given a brick (paper) to place on the Orthodox church outline Bessie Politis, mission leader had prepared, giving the children a visual representation of how coin by coin we could help build an Orthodox church. Goliath (outdoors) games were also an integral part of the

program. Healthy snacks were served daily. Wednesday was Water Day, parents, siblings and friends joined together for water balloons, sprinklers and overall fun. Friday, August 6th, Feast of the Transfiguration, campers received Holy Communion and blessing of the grapes by Father Mylonas.

**NEW YORK SUPREME COURT JUSTICE DISMISSES OCL LAWSUIT
AGAINST GREEK ORTHODOX ARCHDIOCESE OF AMERICA**

New York, NY – On February 2, 2004, several individuals brought an action in New York State Supreme Court against the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America and Archbishop Demetrios seeking to validate the 2003 Charter by the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople.

On August 6, 2004, Justice Ira Gammerman of the New York State Supreme Court rendered a decision granting, with costs, the motion of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese to dismiss the lawsuit. The Justice wrote “I do not think it can seriously be disputed that the Greek Orthodox Church is hierarchical.” The Court relied on a United States Supreme Court decision, *Serbian Eastern Orthodox Diocese for the USA v. Milivojevich*, 426 US 696 (1976), stating that such decision was “squarely on point.” The Court further stated that pursuant to the *Milivojevich* case, “the courts simply do not have the authority to interfere with the manner in which churches organize the titles of their clerics, to determine the eligibility criteria for candidates for Archbishop or bishop, to oversee monasteries, or to inject the state judicial authority into other matters raised by this action.” The Court’s memorandum decision is posted at the Archdiocese website at <http://documents.goarch.org/2004>
